Barnesville Jan 28<sup>th</sup> 1891. This is to certify that I surveyed and located the Alley at the rear of Lots No. 2 and 3 of Morrow Addition commencing for the same at a stone planted as described in feet 50.00 E. 53.75 ft to the S.E. cor. of Lot No. 2 thence with the same bearing 22.4° thence S. 14.1° W. 22 ft. to S.E. cor. of Lot No. 3 of same addition thence with the same bearing 54.0° N. 0° E. to the intersection of what is known as Morrow Alley in Barnesville thence to Barnesville town line being 12 feet in width. Was corrected plat by raising line across the Barnesville at south end of Plat and East end of center alley as ordered by council
