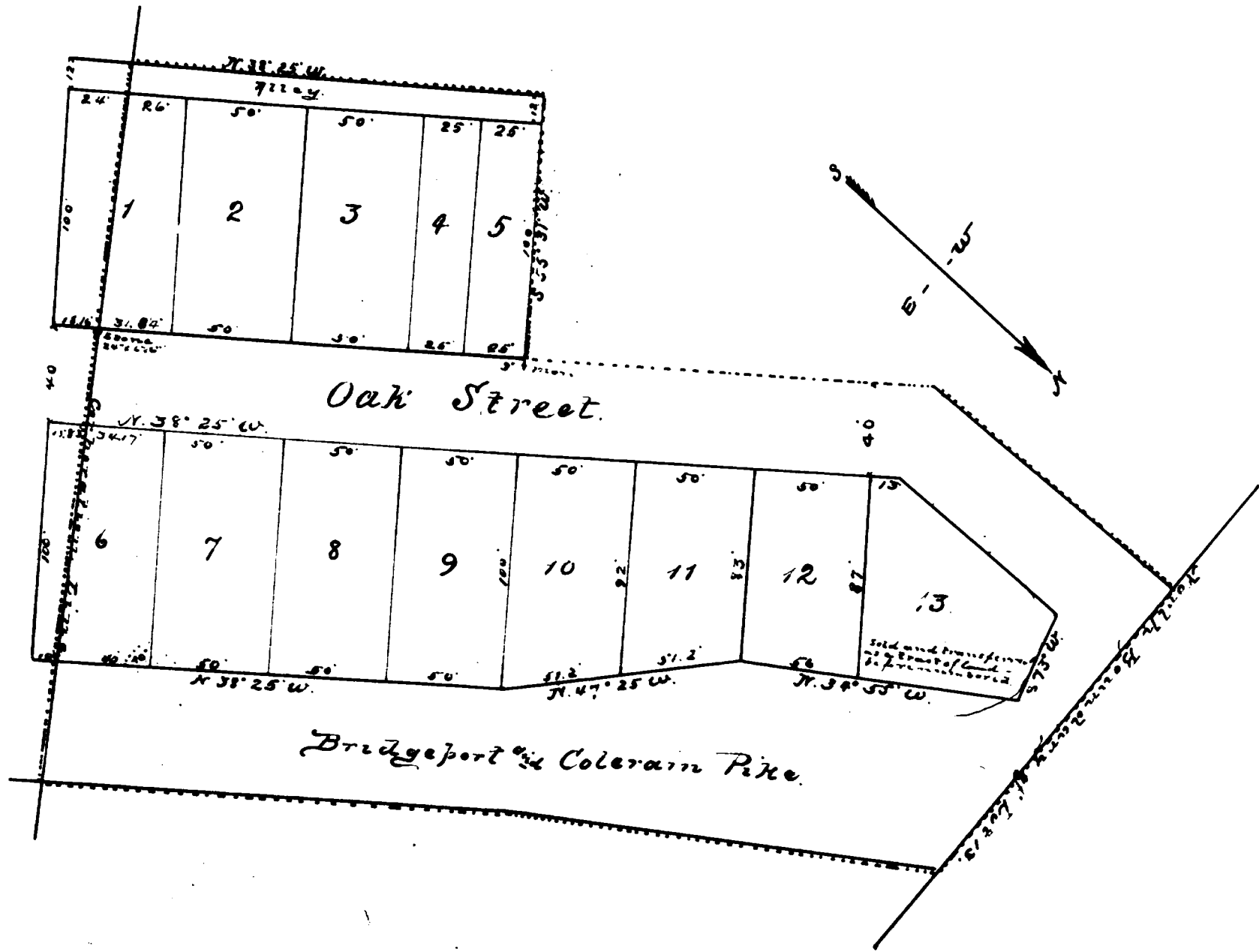


# Hamlet of Brook

I, Abram Lash, a surveyor of the City of Martins Ferry, County of Belmont and State of Ohio, do hereby certify that the within survey and map of the Hamlet of Brook, as above shown is correct. Being located in Penn Township, Belmont County, Ohio and in the 25<sup>th</sup> T. S. R. 2. And the 10<sup>th</sup> part of lot 13 as conveyed to George Breidenstein by Samuel Miller, Sheriff of Belmont County, by deed dated April 29<sup>th</sup> 1879. (And recorded in Volume 74 page 202. The numbers and dimensions of the names and width of the street and alley are shown on the above map. The hamlet of Brook is enclosed by a 30 inch high wall and is a public place and is open upon the public highway. It is bounded on the north by Oak Street, on the south by Bridgeport & Colerain Pike, on the east by the
