

Petition

To the Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio.

The Village of Brookside respectfully represents that by an ordinance duly passed by its Council on the 20th day of September, 1907, the following described territory, to-wit:

**Tract One:** A certain tract of land standing in the name of E. S. Strier and containing about 2 1/2 acres situated in Township 3, Range 2, and in Sections 33 and 34, Belmont County, Ohio, and more particularly described as follows: commencing at a point at the center of the N. end of a bridge over Frasier's Run where the same crosses the National Road; thence S. 80 degrees 40 minutes N. 14 ft. thence leaving the National Road N. 16 degrees W. 847.5 ft. more or less to a point in the N. boundary of Jones & M. Cullagh's lands; thence with said western boundary of Jones & M. Cullagh's lands S. 16 degrees E. 849.5 ft. to the place of beginning.

**Tract Two:** Also a tract of land containing about 7 1/2 acres standing in the name of Wm. Turkle and more particularly described as follows: commencing at a stake in the N. line of Jones & M. Cullagh's lands where the same is intersected by the S. line of the lands owned by W. S. Frasier; thence with the N. line of Jones & M. Cullagh's lands N. 16 degrees W. 65 ft. to the S. W. corner of a tract of land owned by W. S. Frasier; thence leaving the S. W. corner of the lands owned by W. S. Frasier S. 80 degrees 40 minutes N. 14 ft. thence S. 16 degrees E. 65 ft. more or less to a point in the S. line of Wm. Turkle's land; thence with this line in an easterly direction 14 ft. to the place of beginning.

**Tract Three:** Also a tract of land containing 2 1/2 acres standing in the name of W. S. Frasier, and more particularly described as follows: bring in Township 3, Range 2, and in Section 34, Belmont County, Ohio, commencing at the N. W. corner of Jones & M. Cullagh's lands; thence with the line of said land S. 16 degrees E. 130 ft. thence S. 80 degrees 40 minutes N. 100 ft. to a stake in the most westerly line of said lands; thence with this line extended N. 16 degrees W. 130 ft. thence N. 80 degrees 40 minutes E. 100 ft. to the place of beginning.

**Tract Four:** Also a tract of land containing 12 acres more or less, and standing in the name of Jones & M. Cullagh, and more particularly described as follows: bring in Township 3, Range 2, and in Sections 33 and 34, Belmont County, Ohio, and being also a part of the lands purchased by Townsend Frasier (deceased) of Thomas & Ellen Taull by deed recorded in Belmont County Record January 1st, 1840 in Vol. 2, Pages 460 & 461. Beginning for the same in the western boundary line of the said Township Frasier's lands and at the center of the N. end of a bridge on the National Road; thence as per call in the old deed, N. 16 degrees W. 714.5 ft. to a point in the original line; thence leaving the original line N. 80 degrees 40 minutes E. 100 ft. thence by a line which is parallel with the southerly boundary line of the tract hereby described, N. 16 degrees W. 130 ft. thence by a line which is parallel with the southerly boundary line of the tract hereby described, N. 80 degrees 40 minutes E. 331.5 ft. to a stake at the watering trough; thence N. 75 degrees 28 minutes E. 220 ft. to a locust and an elm, intertwined, which are on the southerly side of a wagon road or lane; thence N. 80 degrees 36 minutes E. 45.8 ft. to a stake corner to the lands of W. S. Frasier; thence with western boundary line of said W. S. Frasier's land S. 80 degrees 45 minutes E. 46 1/2 ft. to a stake; thence S. 73 degrees 35 minutes E. with the center of said (30 ft.) lane 739 ft. to a point in the center thereof; thence leaving said lane and land of W. S. Frasier S. 80 degrees 40 minutes N. with northern boundary line of the lands of Mrs. Geo. Medill and others 702 ft. to the N. W. corner of the lands of G. W. Appenzeller; thence with the western boundary line of said Appenzeller's land S. 16 degrees E. 305.6 ft. to said National Road; thence S. 80 degrees 40 minutes N. 12 ft. to the place of beginning.

**Tract Five:** Also a tract of land containing about 19 acres and standing in the name of W. S. Frasier, and more particularly described as follows: bring in Township 3, Range 2, and Section 34 Belmont County, Ohio, beginning at the N. E. corner of the lands of Jones & M. Cullagh thence with easterly boundary line of their lands S. 12 degrees 45 minutes E. 839.4 ft. to a point in the N. E. corner of the Village of Brookside; thence with this corporation line S. 89 degrees 52 minutes E. 849.3 ft. to a point in the E. side of the road; thence with corporation line of the Village of Brookside N. 12 degrees 45 minutes W. 321.6 ft. to a point at an original corner in said corporation line of the Village of Brookside and crossing the road N. 11 degrees 5 minutes W. 110.6 ft. to a stake on the N. side of said road; thence along the N. side of said road N. 6 degrees 15 minutes W. 456.1 ft. to a stake located N. 54 degrees 15 minutes W. 22 ft. from the center of a bridge over Amirend's Run; thence leaving the road S. 89 degrees 45 minutes N. 200.8 ft.; thence S. 64 degrees 20 minutes W. 229.5 ft. to a large locust tree; thence S. 71 degrees 10 minutes W. 465.8 ft. to the place of beginning.

**Tract Six:** Also a tract of land containing 700 acres standing in the name of Townsend Frasier, and now used as a part of the Township Road called Frasier Lane, and more particularly described as follows: bring in Township 3, Range 2, and Section 34, Belmont County, Ohio, beginning at a point at the N. E. corner of S. H. Hamman's lot as originally located; thence along E. boundary of said original lot with the corporation line of the Village of Brookside S. 12 degrees 45 minutes E. 97.2 ft. to a corner in the corporation line of the Village of Brookside; thence with the corporation line S. 89 degrees 52 minutes E. 15.4 ft. to the S. W. corner of W. S. Frasier's land; thence with the N. boundary of his land N. 12 degrees 45 minutes W. 99.6 ft. to the S. E. corner of Jones & M. Cullagh's land; thence with the S. boundary of the Jones & M. Cullagh's lands in a westerly direction 15 ft. to the place of beginning.

An accurate map of which territory the parts of said map were annexed is hereto attached marked exhibit A.

Said Village respectfully petitions that said territory may be annexed to said Village.

Transcript of the journal of the Commissioners of Belmont County Ohio, relating to the annexation of certain territory to the Village of Brookside.

Commissioners' Office, Belmont County, Ohio, December 2, 1907.

The Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, met this day in regular session; present A. S. Holloway, Robert M. Millen and J. H. Martin, Commissioners and A. W. Beatty, Auditor and Clerk of the Board.

In the matter of the petition of the Village of Brookside for the annexation of certain territory.

This day came Everly South, Mayor and duly authorized agent for the Village of Brookside, Ohio, and on behalf of said Village presented to the Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, a petition of said Village of Brookside, Ohio, asking for the annexation to said Village the contiguous territory as described in said petition.

Thereupon the Commissioners ordered said petition and map or plat accompanying same to be filed in the office of the County Auditor and assign said petition for hearing on the 10th day of February, 1908, at one o'clock P. M. at the Commissioners in said Belmont County, to which time further proceedings in reference thereto are continued.

The Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, met this day in special session; present A. S. Holloway, Robert M. Millen and J. H. Martin, Commissioners and A. W. Beatty, Auditor and Clerk of the Board.

In the matter of the annexation of certain territory to the Village of Brookside.

The Commissioners of the County of Belmont, State of Ohio, proceeded this day to hear the petition of the incorporated Village of Brookside to obtain the annexation of the territory in its petition described, to the said Village of Brookside. Said in open meeting all the persons desiring to be heard for or against the granting of said petition and considered all the affidavits and oral testimony presented with reference thereto, and being fully advised in the premises, find that said petition contains all the matters required by law; that the statements are true; that the territory sought to be annexed is adjacent to the Village of Brookside; that the petition contains a full description of said territory sought to be annexed; that the map of said territory attached to said petition is accurate; that said village of Brookside did by a majority of its members of its council duly pass an ordinance authorizing the annexation prayed for in the petition to be made, and that the notice required by law to be made by the filing of said petition and objects of said petition have been duly given or made, and that it is right and proper that said petition be granted. It is therefore ordered that the prayer of said petition be granted and that the territory described in the said petition may be annexed to the Village of Brookside, in accordance with law and as prayed for in the petition. It is further ordered that a certified transcript, signed by a majority of this Board, of all the orders and proceedings of this Board, relative to said petition and hearing thereon, together with said petition and map attached thereto and all papers on file relating to said matter, be transmitted at once to the Recorder of said County of Belmont.
