Together with the right to mine and remove the same and also the right to mine and remove other coal, now or hereafter owned through the same, without liability for damages to the surface thereof caused by the mining and removing of said coal. The said Margaret Wilson, wife of said Charles C. Wilson hereby releases her right of dower in said Streets and Alleys.
