ORDINANCE #699
 AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE AN UNNAMED ALLEY

Whereas, on the 18th day of February, 1975, a petition
 by persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of an unnamed alley was duly
 presented to council praying that said alley be vacated; and
 Whereas, the petitioners constitute all the owners of all the
 property abutting on the portion of the alley proposed to be vacated; and

Whereas, said unnamed alley is described as follows:
 Description for an alley for proposed vacation situated in
 William P. Ramsey's 1st addition as recorded in Volume 9,
 Page 53 of the Belmont County Record of Plats. Said alley
 being bounded on the North by the North line of the said
 addition, on the West by Lots Number Forty-Five (45), Forty-
 Four (44), and Forty-Two (42), of the said addition, on the
 South by North line of Hopple Street, and on the East by lots
 number Thirty-Two (32), Thirty-Three (33), and Thirty-Four (34),
 of the said addition and being more particularly described as
 follows:

Beginning for a description at a stake on the North line of
 Hopple Street at the Southeast corner of Lot Forty-Two (42),
 of the William P. Ramsey's 1st addition and on the Southwest
 corner of the said alley. Thence from the beginning and with
 the North line of Hopple Street S 42° 34' E. 16' to a stake
 on the Southeast corner of the said alley and on the Southwest
 corner of Lot Number Thirty-Two (32). Thence leaving the North
 line of Hopple Street and with the West line of Lot Thirty-Two
 (32), N 47° 26' E. 4.96' to a stake. Thence N 10° 22' E. 170.07'
 along the West lines of lots Thirty-Three (33), and Thirty-Four
 (34), to a stake on the North line of the said addition and at
 the Northeast corner of the said alley. Thence with the North
 line of the said addition N 54° 17' W. 17.70' to a stake on the
 Northwest corner of the said alley. Thence leaving the North
 line of the said addition S 10° 22' W. 172.29' along the East
 line of Lots Forty-Five (45), Forty-Four (44), and Forty-Two
 (42), to a stake. Thence S 47° 26' W. 36.60' to the place of
 beginning containing 3,315.47 Sq. Ft.

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good
 cause for such vacation as petitioned for; that it is no longer of use to the
 public; that it will not be detrimental to the public interest; and that said
 vacation should be made.

Therefore, be it ordained by the council of the Village of Powhatan
 Point, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION ONE

That said unnamed alley as described above, be, and the same is
 hereby, vacated.

SECTION TWO

That this ordinance shall be and remain in force from and after the
 earliest period allowed by law.

Passed at a regular meeting of the council of said village held this
 18th day of March, 1975, by the yeas and nays of 6 members.
